Mr. Steven Schipani is a Social Sector Specialist in the Asian Development Bank's (ADB) Southeast Asia Regional Department. He is principally responsible for the preparation and administration of subregional tourism sector projects supported by ADB. Mr. Schipani currently serves as the Project Officer for the Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS) Sustainable Tourism Development Project being implemented in Lao PDR and Viet Nam, and is also assisting governments in Brunei Darussalam, Indonesia, Philippines, Malaysia East ASEAN Growth Area (BIMP-EAGA) formulate a subregional tourism strategy.

Mr. Schipani started his career in Southeast Asia as a US Peace Corps Volunteer in northeast Thailand and went on to work as a sustainable tourism advisor to several GMS governments and international organizations. His main areas of expertise are sustainable tourism planning and evaluation, cultural and natural heritage management, guide training and ecotourism management in protected areas. He has written widely about sustainable tourism, poverty reduction and heritage protection in the GMS.
